FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



For many people, July is the month for summer vacation. It is a time to get away from work, etc. for a week or more in order to relax and re-create yourself (recreation). I know some people in the congregation have already been on vacation. I know that Shirley and I will be taking some vacation time at the end of the month as we go visit our kids in Colorado (July 30-August 9).

Did you know that God built the idea of vacation into our lives at the very beginning of creation. We call it "Sabbath". The word "Sabbath" literally means "rest day." As part of the Third Commandment, God said through Moses, "Six days you shall labor and do all your work, but the seventh day is a Sabbath to the LORD your God. On it you shall not do any work, neither you, nor your son or daughter, nor your manservant or maidservant, nor your animals, nor the alien within your gates. For in six days the LORD made the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them, but He rested on the seventh day. Therefore the LORD blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy" (Exodus 20:9-11).

Several years ago, I was part of a learning group that studied material by Steven Ogne and Thomas Nebel. They suggested that a person needs to "Divert Daily" with some quiet time with God, "Withdraw Weekly" with a day of personal Sabbath, "Maintain Monthly" with some form of Monthly retreat to regain perspective and grow closer to Jesus, and "Abandon Annually" with a minimum three-day retreat to concentrate on your relationship with God. I found these suggestions helpful although I don't always do them. In a way, each of them is tied to the Sabbath. The whole purpose of the Sabbath was to set-time apart from your normal life so you can remember God as your Creator and Redeemer. Let's look at each of these time frames.

Daily — God created us with the need to rest. In fact, in Genesis one, the days are marked "evening and morning." The Jewish day begins at sundown. It starts with a period of rest so that we are able to do our best during the day. Many studies have shown the importance of sleep. In addition, some form of devotion or prayer each day keeps us in contact with our Creator.

Weekly — Once a week God commands that we do no work. It is to be "a day of sacred assembly" (Leviticus 23:3). The church moved this day to the first day of the week in honor of Jesus' Easter resurrection. It is a day for worship. It is a day to stop the busy-ness of our lives and remember that we are God's people. It is a day to celebrate all the blessings He has given us (like family, friends, etc).

Monthly — This is the one I struggle with most. It is also the one area I don't see included in the Bible. Nevertheless I can see some value in taking time each month to review my calendar, my values and my goals.

Annually — Interestingly, in Leviticus 25 we read, "In the seventh year the land is to have a sabbath of rest, a sabbath to the LORD. Do not sow your fields or prune your vineyards. Do not reap what grows of itself or harvest the grapes of your untended vines. The land is to have a year of rest" (v. 4, 5). And then in v. 8, the Lord commands the year of Jubilee which is seven Sabbath years (49 years). God designed us to rest. We need periods of rest to get caught up on sleep, to renew our relationship with God, and to enjoy the blessings God has given us. It is healthy to take time off for vacation. It is important to take time so God can re-create you and revitalize you for life.

If you have a vacation planned, enjoy it. And don't forget to take some time to thank God for the blessings He has given you.

PERSECUTED CHRISTIANS AROUND THE WORLD

MIGERIA: Leah Sharibu remains in captivity almost four months after Boko Haram kidnapped her and 109 other school girls on February 19 from the Government Girls Science and Technical College in Yobe state. Most of the girls were returned about four weeks after the kidnapping, but five were reportedly killed and Leah is still being held. She is believed to be the only Christian among those kidnapped. One of the released girls said Leah hasn't been released because she refuses to deny Jesus. Pray that Leah will remain strong in faith and experience Christ's presence during her captivity. Also pray that she will be released soon and that her mother will be encouraged and strengthened during this ordeal. Pray that members of Boko Haram will be inspired by Leah's faith and seek to know the God she serves.



PINOCHLE CARDS






